About the project

The idea of the mews is the starting point for Blackbox. In contrast to the traditional mews architecture of solid brick enclosures with tiny windows and little daylight, this design is filled with light, but still respects the contextual language of α 'solid box'.

The design features of the entrance courtyard and staircase are key to the light penetrating into the heart of the house. As a result of the area given over to the courtyard, the ephemeral qualities created are 'borrowed' back in terms of the light and views, with the internal staircase serving as a journey up Blackbox right through to the skylight. This can best be described as the layering of views and the 'bouncing' of light within the house.

The designer is also the client and hence, there is an uncompromised approach from initial design through to completion.
